## **General guidance**

- Troupe Directors may limit the number of points awarded in any one category.
- Encourage students to earn points across multiple areas.

Participate in virtual field trips organized by the teacher	<b>1 point</b> = 10 hours of participation	
Attend virtual theatre club meetings	<b>1 point</b> = 10 meetings	
Create and deliver a presentation on Thespian history	<b>1 point</b> = 10 hours of prep and presentation
